# Tools and Supplies: <br> Round Nose Plier <br> Flat Nose Plier <br> Flush Cutter <br> Headpins (@100) <br> 7 Inches of 6-8mm Chain <br> Clasp and Open Jump Ring <br> 90-100 Assorted Pearls or Beads 

Step 1 - Choose Your color palette. This design works best if you choose one main color and several contrasting accent colors.

Step 2 - String all your beads on headpins.

Step 3 - Make dangles. Bend headpin into a right angle.
 Clip wire to $3 / 8$ of an inch. Use round nose plier to roll into a loop.


Step 4 - Finish approximately 90-100 beaded dangles for a 7 inch bracelet. Make about 8-12 of each accent color and the rest in your primary color.

Step 5 - Lay out large beads. Design looks best if beads are distributed evenly by size and color. For a 7 inch bracelet, attach beads to 6 inches of chain, leaving a 1 inch tail.

Step 6 - Open loops using flat nose plier and attach to chain links. You may have to do some counting to get it even!

Step 7 - Attach all large beads first before moving on to smaller beads.

Step 8 - Lay out smaller beads by color and attach one color at a time, keeping the colors and sizes evenly distributed.

Step 10 - Watch your bracelet fill out and take shape as you add each color!

Step 11 - Finish by adding a clasp with an open jump ring and an accent bead of your choice at the end of the chain!
