| Supplies needed - | $9-6 \mathrm{~mm}$ Czech teardrop shape bead |
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| $9-4 \mathrm{~mm}$ Czech glass round assorted beads of your choice |  |
| $1-$ silk cord, size 6 - color of your choice |  |
| $2-$ crimp beads |  |
| $2-$ crimp covers |  |
| 1 - closed spring ring -5 mm |  |
| 1 - closed jump ring -5 mm |  |

To start the bracelet, tie a knot at the end of the cord (not by the needle).


String on one crimp bead. String on one closed jump ring. Bring the needle back through the crimp bead so it captures the closed jump ring and pull the cord until the crimp bead is about one inch above the knot at the end of the cord. Crimp the crimp bead and trim the excess cord.

String on one 4 mm bead, one teardrop bead - continue this pattern ending with a teardrop bead.
Now to start knotting. We will be using the $1 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ measurement on the Easy Knotter. I like using the $1 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ measurement when I create my bracelets. Gives it just the right spacing.

We are going to tie a knot after the crimp bead. Let the crimp bead hang and grab the cord to create the loop for the knot. Bring the cord and crimp bead through the loop of the knot. Place the knot on the post and pull until the crimp bead is right up to the post. Take your next bead and bring it down to approximately 2 inches before the post. With the cord in one hand and the bead in the other hand, lift the knot off the post and have the knot rest on the Easy Knotter.

With the cord in one hand and the bead in the other hand, take the bead that is in your hand and bring it down to the knot in one quick movement while holding onto the cord. This will close the knot right up to the crimp bead.

Continuing the bracelet, we are going to use the $1 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ measurement. Using the instructions above, let the crimp bead hang and create the loop for the knot. Place the knot on the post and pull until the previous knot is at the $1 / 8^{\prime \prime}$ measurement. With your index finger and thumb lift the knot off the post and hold the knot and pull the cord with your opposite hand.

Bring a bead to the knot you just create and using the instruction above, create the loop for the knot and place it on the post and pull until the bead and cord at up to the post. Take your next bead and bring it down to approximately 2 inches before the post. With the cord in one hand and the bead in the other, lift the knot off the post and have the knot rest on the Easy Knotter. With the cord in one hand and the bead in the other hand, take the bead in your hand and bring it down to the knot in one quick movement while holding onto the cord. This will close the knot right up to the bead.

Continuing the above instructions until all the beads are knotted. String on one crimp bead and one closed spring ring. Bring the needle back through the crimp bead capturing the spring ring. Pull until the crimp bead and spring ring are at the last knot. Crimp the crimp bead and trim the excess cord. Attach the crimp covers and enjoy!!
